An ever-evolving lifestyle store showcasing US, UK and Australian brands with a slant towards photography, art and homewares.

Talented artist Anya Brock offers bright originals, framed canvas prints and colourful homewares in her joy-filled gallery.

Think heritage corner shopfront, contemporary furniture by Remington Matters, bold typography, and the best sandwiches in town.

- 16 LOLA'S PIZZA**
Peggy's little sister - a space and menu that reflects the eclectic, hyper-local and vibrant community of Fremantle.

- 17 OTIS + MAVE**
Freo's best coffee? It's a big call but we love the brews at this friendly specialty coffee space - grab a seat on the pavement and take a break.

- 18 REPUBLIC OF FREMANTLE**
Serious gin distillery and sophisticated cocktail bar wrapped in a beautiful heritage building reimagined by spaceagency architects.

- 19 GAGE ROADS**
Finespun, Mata Design and ICS turned the heritage A Shed into a bustling casual venue offering beer, wine, food and epic water views.

- 20 DARAWNATURE STUDIO**
One of Freo's best kept secrets. Enter another world through an archway that leads to a gallery cafe serving some of Freo's best coffee.

- 21 ODE TO SIRENS**
An ode to the troubadours, poets and writers - one of our new fave bars offers Greek-centric food and wine and lots and lots of records.

- 22 VIN POPULI**
A retro-styled Italian eatery bringing la dolce vita to Fremantle's West End, with a beautiful interior designed by rising stars Rezen Studio.
11 High Street

- 23 DARLING DARLING**
Designed by Ashley Sutton, Darling Darling looks and feels like you've stepped into a seafarer's saloon from the 1800s.
36 Henry Street

- 24 BREAD IN COMMON**
Celebrated for its modern approach to dining and spaceagency architects' restrained heritage warehouse restoration. A Freo icon.
43 Pakenham Street

- 25 STRANGE COMPANY**
A former wetsuit factory transformed into Fremantle's first small bar by spaceagency architects - FDW's 'other office.'
5 Nairn Street

- 26 LIONS & TIGERS**
A 19th century warehouse, turned modern Indian bar and eatery, with an interior and furniture design by Gabrielle Scott.
8 Bannister Street

- 27 CALAMITY'S ROD**
A nano-brewery in the heart of town. The shipping container bar is part pop-up and mostly just good fun.
15 Bannister Street

- 28 GOOD THINGS**
Delicious food and great coffee in a building designed by Fremantle icon, Brian Klopper. Sit on the street or in the cozy mezzanine above.
16 Bannister Street

- 29 RONNIE NIGHTS**
One word - fun! Think Italianate tiles, lots of plants, great drinks, good tunes and late nights - another clever spaceagency design.
77 Market Street

- 30 NIEUW RUIN**
Take up residence on the verandah and settle in to sample a 300+ bottle wine list, seasonal cocktails, craft beer and a hyper-local menu.
12 Norfolk Street

- 31 FOMO FREO**
Grab a meal at one of FOMO'S hawker-style food vendors then explore the international public art collection curated by Design Theory.

- 32 URBAN WINERY**
This lush, plant-filled bar and restaurant is WA's first urban winery, fermenting and bottling WA-grown grapes on-site.

- 33 SHORT ORDER**
Dangerously good burgers and fries, a great wine list, and an interior by Mata Design that references a retro American diner.
3 William Street

- 37 HOUGOUMONT HOTEL**
Architect MCD has combined old and new with style in this refurbished heritage building with unique shipping-container rooms.
15 Bannister Street

Fremantle is built on a series of limestone hills known by the Nyoongar people as Booyeembara.

Many of Fremantle's enduring buildings are built from locally quarried limestone and as a result the city feels deeply connected to its place. This strong material and atmospheric presence is embodied in the designed Warders Hotel, Fremantle Design Week's hospitality partner.

The Warders Hotel is home to small bar Gimlet, and restaurant Emily Taylor. All three have received design awards for architects MCA.

- 36 WARDERS HOTEL**
A boutique hotel in the cottages that were once the Fremantle Warders' homes - a pocket of calm in Freo's vibrant heart.
19 Henderson Street

- 34 GIMLET**
Tiny and delightful cocktail bar in the Warders Hotel. Perfect for a quick drink before dinner or a sneaky nightcap.

- 35 EMILY TAYLOR**
Contemporary Asian food and a bohemian aesthetic that works perfectly against the heritage fabric of the Warders Hotel.
